


Che DIVINE LIFE

THE GITA-IDEAL OF SANNYASA

Sri Swami Sivananda

Follow the Gita-ideal of Sannyasa. Practice of physical nudity does not confer Mukti on you. Remaining inactive in a cave does not raise you to Godhead. Bhagavan Krishna has beautifully given the definition of Sannyasa in His Gita. Everyone should follow that.

The Gita-Sannyasa is for every man and woman in the world. This Sannyasa is Yoga; and the Yoga of the Gita is Sannyasa. Yoga and Sannyasa are inseparable. Without the renunciation of Sankalpas, you cannot practice Yoga. Tyaga and Vairagya Abhimana cling to you, when you have renounced everything, except the ego. Now you think 'I am a householder'; when you take Sannyasa without renouncing the ego, you will think, "I am a Sannyasin". Such a Sannyasin develops his own egoism. He is bound by subtler and stronger ties to the wheel of Samsara; for, his egoism is subtler and more powerful.

Gita-Sannyasa is the culmination of Buddhi Yoga. You should have real Viveka. You should have intelligent discrimination between the Real and the unreal; you should know what to renounce.

People generally renounce some superficialities and pose to be great Sannyasins. Throwing away a cloth, eating some odd things, and such other whimsical practices mean Sannyasa for them. Renunciation of objects is very necessary, no doubt; but without first renouncing the ego, this mere external renunciation is of little value. With every object renounced, this internal ego will gain strength. You will proudly think and say—"I have given up sugar; I have given up shoes; I never touch money. I am a great Tyagi." If, on the other hand, when you renounce the ego through Vichara, selfless service, Pranayama, Japa, Kirtan, Dhyana and Svadhyaya, when the ego is thinned out, the objects will lose their power of attraction and drop off even without your effort. That is the Gitaldeal of Sannyasa.

In the name of Sannyasa, people condemn service; they condemn Murti-Puja. It is delusion

only. Only a Dattatreya, only a Suka Maharshi, could remain immersed in Brahmic bliss all the twenty-four hours. For every Sannyasin today, service is necessary; worship is necessary. Without these, he cannot evolve.

YAJNA, DANA AND TAPAS

Bhagavan emphatically declares that Yajna, Dana and Tapas should not be renounced. The universe is maintained by Yajna. Self-sacrifice is Yajna. Sacrifice of one's ego in the fire of selfless service unto humanity is a great Yajna. Dissemination of spiritual knowledge is the greatest Yajna, the womb of all Yajnas. Every selfless action is Yajna. Every selfless action purifies your heart, and takes you nearer to the great goal of Self-realisation.

Charity is very essential. Gift of money alone is not charity. To pray for another is charity. To serve another with the body is charity. To be kind and loving is charity. To forgive and forget some harm done to you is charity. A kind word said to a suffering man is charity. Everyone can do charity. Everyone should do charity in whatever manner he is capable of.

Tapas is control of body, mind

and speech. And, the Lord has clearly pointed out that mortification of the body is not real Tapas. Control your senses through Shama, Dama, Titiksha. Control your mind through Vichara and Viveka. Control your speech through the practice of Mouna, Mita-bhashana and Madhura-bhashana. This is Tapas.

These should never be renounced. A man-of-God is ever busy in the welfare of all beings. He is not an idler. The idler is afraid to work. He is effeminate. To him, Sannyasa is only a cloak. He cannot mix with anybody. His Vairagya is only an excuse for escapism. He is, so to say, afraid of himself. He is the picture of delusion. He is pessimist and is sunk in gloom.

QUALIFICATION OF A SANNYASI

The real Sannyasin, on the other hand, is full of divine virtues. He is all-bliss and peace, and he serves vigorously. He works not for the sake of himself, but for the sake of service itself in the Yajna-spirit. He is outwardly seen to engage himself in actions in the same way as any ordinary man, but there is a vast difference; and that is, the Sannyasin is unattached. He does not long for anything. He works

selflessly. He does everything as worship of the Supreme Lord. That is the secret of his tranquillity, equanimity, and even-mindedness in success and failure, praise and censure. Such a man is a glorious Sannyasin.

There is no work which is specially dear to him; there is nothing which is repugnant to him.

He greets every piece of work as service of the Lord. He does every work well. And he offers every work as a flower at the Lotus-feet of the Lord. Such Sannyasins are the greatest need of the hour. The world should have ideal and dynamic Sannyasins. May you all become the embodiments of the Gita-Ideal of Sannyasa!

A real Yogi does not make any difference between a menial and respectable work. It is only an ignorant man who makes such a difference. Some aspirants are humble in the beginning of their spiritual career. When they get some name and fame, some followers, admirers, devotees and disciples, they become victims to pride. They cannot do any service. They cannot carry anything on their heads or hands. That Yogi who carries the trunk on his head without the slightest feeling in the Railway platform amidst the multitude of his admirers, disciples and devotees without making any outward show of humility must be admired. Sage Jada Bharata carried the palanquin of a Raja on his shoulders without murmuring. Lord Krishna shampooed the legs of a Raja when His barber-devotee was on leave. Sri Rama carried a pot of water for the ablution of one of His devotees. Sri Krishna took the form of a menial servant as Vithoo and paid the money to the Nawab on behalf of His devotee Dhamaji. If you really want to grow in the spiritual path, you must do all sorts of service daily till the end of your life. Then only you are safe. Do not stop doing service when you have become a famous Yogi. The spirit of service must enter every nerve, cell, tissue, and bone of your body. It must be ingrained in you. Then only you will become a real, fully-developed practical Vedantin. Is there any greater Vedantin or Karma Yogin than Lord Buddha? He still lives in our hearts because the spirit of service was ingrained in him and he spent his whole life in serving others in a variety of ways. A magnanimous soul, one without a second. You can also become a Buddha if you apply yourself diligently to selfless service with the right mental attitude. Swami Sivananda

RENUNCIATION OF SATGURU SIVANANDA— A UNIVERSAL BLESSING

Today it is our unique good fortune and a joy to commemorate a great event of wonderful significance and supreme importance that took place 35 years ago, and which has borne its fruit in the form of immense and inestimable blessedness to mankind of the present times. That far-off event has proved to be like unto the birth of a river with its lifegiving water that having sprung forth in a remote distance flows out later into a stream of blessedness, bringing life, prosperity, fertility and happiness to innumerable people over vast lands. I refer to the great renunciation, the holy act of Tyaga done by our Worshipful Lord and Master, Satguru Sivananda Bhagawan, at whose feet we have the privilege to live and to serve.

Oh! What a blessed day it was when our Divine Satgurudev snapped the bondage of secular life, turned his face towards the holy Himalayas and set foot upon the ancient path of Nivritti and Sannyasa. Across the seas in a far-off land, a holy blaze lit up in the heart of

him, who was to be known to the world as Sivananda, the great Sage and Seer of the Himalayas. The fire of Vairagya burst into the blaze of renunciation and the result was the radiance of spiritual life and Divine realisation.

FULFILMENT OF A TRADITIONAL IDEAL

This tremendous turning point in the life of our Worshipful Gurudev Sivanandaji Maharaj is, in truth, the fulfilment of a grand tradition of this sacred land, Bharatavarsha, our mother country. This holy nation has, as one of the grandest aspects of her culture, the ideal of renunciation. It is in India that the man of renunciation is worshipped by everyone. It is here that Tyaga is given the foremost place and the highest value. 'Na karmana na prajaya dhanena tyagenaike amritatwamanashuh'— is the emphatic declaration of the wise ones. Through renunciation, you attain the Supreme seat of Immortality.

1st June, three and a half decades ago, the fulfilment of this timehonoured and worthy tradition resulted in bestowing to the modern humanity a World-Teacher, who was destined to guide, help, save and illuminate countless souls, scorched in the fiery desert of modern materialistic Samsar. This World-Teacher shines resplendent in his spiritual glory before us upon this blessed day in the form of Sivananda Satgurudev. Behold him — This dazzling repository of the fire of Renunciation and the radiance of Divine Wisdom. We have in him a Superman.

SUPERMAN

It is easy to perform a solitary act of sudden renunciation in the white heat of divine emotion and inspiration. But, it requires an extraordinary personality to keep up that highest pitch of Vairagya or renunciation and make it blaze on continuously throughout one's later life. Such a superman we have in our Master Sivananda, who is the veritable living embodiment of Tyaga-Agni and Jnana Jyoti (fire of renunciation and light of knowledge). The blaze of supreme Renunciation is constantly burning within him and the radiance of Wisdom emanates from him. The moment you approach him, all worldly thoughts fly away, desires and cravings are burnt up, and you enter into a spiritual mood. This is the wonderful force of his spiritual personality that is dominated by the twin divine forces of Renunciation and Atmic Knowledge.

Renouncing self for the sake of bringing happiness unto others is a distinct and dominant feature of the Vedic way of life. In each of the four Stages of Brahmacharya, Grihastha, Vanaprastha and Sannyasa, in the life of man, this ideal of self-sacrifice, self-denial and self-renunciation was ideally incorporated and actively inculcated. It forms and should form the warp and the woof of the fabric of our individual and national life. 'What can I get for myself' is not the question the Hindu heart seeks to answer. Rather, it is 'what can I give unto others', that is the question implicit in the heart of every son and daughter of Bharatavarsha. Thus, by his renunciation, Gurudev gave himself unto modern humanity.

DIVINE MISSION

It is revealed in the life of Buddha, the Enlightened Shakya Muni, that, as he arose from his tree at Bodh-Gaya, he was filled with an ecstasy of Divine intoxication and bliss and 40 days passed away as if they were 40 seconds. And then, when he contemplated the miseries of mankind, the thought arose in him, "Shall I preach the Gospel of going beyond pain, sorrow and death?" But, in his spiritual vision, he perceived that there were very few who were fit and eager to receive this doctrine; for, they were sunk in the pursuit of sense-pleasure. Thus, when he was about to abandon his idea of spreading his doctrine, we are told how the Celestials appeared and entreated Gautama, the Illumined, to give the Wisdom of life to those that would receive it. Thus, we find that the Dharmachakra was set into motion in the deer park at Saranath, near Kashi, for the good of all and the happiness of all.

Even so, in a greater measure, the renunciation of Satgurudev and its resultant Divine realisation have flowered forth into countless blessednesses to suffering men and women of this fear-ridden and striferidden modern age, with its chaotic life of desire and passion. Sadhana and a life of renunciation and worship, have all flowered forth as a tangible and effective blessedness, having for their source the supreme act of Gurudev's Tyaga.

GURUDEV'S MISSION IN THIS WORLD

This is the most auspicious occasion, presenting itself before us annually so that we may contemplate a little on the nature of the great mission with which Gurudev Sri Swami Sivanandaji Maharaj can be said to have veritably incarnated himself as a ray of divinity on this Earth.

The great significance of his mission in this world is to be the object of our contemplation. This would be perhaps the greatest service that his humble followers and disciples would offer at his holy feet as their Seva; because, no service to the Guru can be regarded as perfect, as complete, as to attune the inner being of oneself with the intention of the Guru. Physical service and the external forms of service are there; but, when there is no inner attunement with the purpose, the intention and the meaning of the vision of the Guru, physical service becomes inadequate and does not serve its purpose. So, together with the ardour, fervour and devotion to the outer forms which his great mission has taken as this Divine Life Society—service to humanity through cultural revival, etc.—we would do well to focus our attention on the central point of his mission, which is the be-all and end-all, we may say, of his entire life and the whole gamut of his activities and works in this world.

That mission for which he came is the reconstruction of the concept of spiritual life. The concept of spiritual life is as old as creation itself. Spirituality is not the new innovation of any saint. But, every saint and sage comes with a peculiar purpose: to accentuate, emphasise or floodlight certain aspects of this concept which, through the passage of time, gets diluted into the ordinary life of the individual, and spirituality becomes one of the aspects of human activity rather than the vital centrality of the very existence of people. We may simply say that Gurudev Sri Swami Sivanandaji Maharaj was one of the greatest spiritual personalities of our times, a stalwart of the spirit whose main

teaching was the lesson that he imparted concerning the goal of life. All other functions, all other works, duties and activities contribute to the fulfilment of this spiritual purpose which is struggling to gradually unfold itself through the personality of man. This is a very important point which he came to emphasise in our lives, lest we should forget its meaning, its importance, lest we should mistake it for one of the several functions and duties of our life. It is not one of the functions of life. It is the only function of life as a whole, of which other functions are auxiliaries, accessories, preparations and contributory values. As I mentioned, he came to reconstruct the concept of spirituality itself—which mainly lies in the fact that the spiritual is the background and the rock bottom of the entire evolutionary process of all beings in the world. Life is an onward movement towards God. Life is a Godward movement; and the mystique of life does not necessarily mean human life. Life is larger than what can be included merely in the species of humanity. The whole life of the universe, the entire function of creation, is an irresistible tendency

towards God-realisation. In this sense, it is that people say that the universe is a process. It is not a static mass of matter before us, lying as if it were dead. Matter and life, mind and intellect, are all stages of the unfoldment of life towards spiritual realisation. The work that you do in your offices, the duties that you perform in the various vocations of your life, your very existence itself, the breath that you breathe, the thoughts that you think, the words that you utter—everything is a manifold form of spirituality.

Vairagya and Sannyasa, renunciation and spirituality, were the very stuff and fibre of the personality of Gurudev. He was a fire of renunciation and a fire of the spirit, a flaming spiritual personality before us, the like of which it is difficult to see. This personality of Gurudev is clinging to us in another language even today, even now at this moment, even though his physical personality may be said to have withdrawn itself into its causal elements. The relation between the Guru and the disciple is not a physical one. It is not a connection temporarily established between two bodies or individuals, ending with

the end of the body. Not so! Far from it, is the truth. The initiation which the disciple receives from the Guru is the contact that is established between the Guru and the disciple inwardly, spiritually. It is a relationship between two souls, not two bodies. In this sense, the Guru never dies, nor is the Guru ever born. God Himself, Paramatman, the Supreme Ishvara comes as the great teacher to mankind through the vehicle of these personalities of the Gurus. While the personalities may oftentimes be human, and the vehicles or means through which this great message is conveyed to mankind may be visible forms, the message itself is eternal. It is the light of the spirit which cannot be extinguished by the winds of the world. Such light was shining in the personality of Gurudev Swami Sivananda. Should we not regard ourselves as thrice blessed that most of us had the blessing and the opportunity of visibly seeing him, living with him, and physically coming in contact with him every day-to see God moving among us, as it were?

Well, he is yet alive. No one but he, nothing but his invisible hands could be responsible for the increasing rapidity of the movement and work of The Divine Life mission. It is continuing in leaps and bounds, we may say. He has withdrawn himself from one form and entered into another form. Change of form is not destruction of personality; it is only a difference introduced into the mode of working of the very same power and force. Immanence is his form at present.

In this immanent form of his spiritual personality, he works through us, speaks through us, drives us, sustains us. The Divine Life Society itself is a wonder. It is a miracle. Many disciples, many admirers of this Society have asked, "Did Swamiji work miracles? Did he work wonders in this world, as we hear of in connection with the lives of great Masters?" What could be a greater wonder, a greater miracle than the existence of this Society itself—the way in which it works and the effect which it has produced upon the mind of mankind, the transformation that it has brought about in the hearts of people, and the emphasis that it has laid on the importance of the life of the spirit? What can be a greater wonder than

the incarnation of the Spirit itself in the heart of man? This miracle he has worked, and he is working. We are indeed happy. We are blessed.

We are thrice blessed and most fortunate. There is absolutely no doubt that God has been immensely gracious upon us. Gurudev has been kind to us; and I for one, can confidently say that I see God is definitely pleased with us. Though we

may be moving with faltering steps, yet, it is honestly and sincerely towards the reception of this Divine Grace.

May this central point of the great mission of Gurudev Swami Sivanandaji Maharaj—the focal point of the life of the Spirit in this universe—be the object of our contemplation on this auspicious day. God bless you all.

Rely on your own self. Do not be credulous. Believe not in any dogmas. Hear the inner voice of the soul or promptings of the pure conscience. Be not a slave. Do not sell your liberty. Thou art the immortal soul. Destroy the inferiority complex. Draw power, courage, strength from within. Be free. Have no blind faith. Reason out carefully and then accept anything. Do not be carried away by blind surging emotions. Subdue them. Expand. There is a vast magazine of power and knowledge within you. It needs ignition. Then the whole mystery of the Self will be revealed unto thee. The darkness of ignorance will be dispelled by the light of knowledge of the Self. Constant meditation on the Atman is the master-key to open the realms of knowledge. I have given here the gist of Karma Yoga and Vedanta in a few lines. Taste the Nectar and attain immortality, eternal bliss and perennial joy. This is the goal of life. This is the end and aim of existence. Karma Yoga and Upasana will prepare you to realise this highest goal.

TRYING SITUATIONS Sri Swami Venkatesananda

You can well imagine that it was a headache to the secretary, and the treasurer, and so on, of an organisation, i.e. the Ashram, to have a person like Swami Sivananda as the Head. He just went on giving, giving, giving—he did not seem to have any notion where the money came from or where it went. But, I think he knew, though others thought he did not. He was aware all the time that the source is also the goal. "It comes from Him and returns to Him: We are merely channels. We think we are running this institution, this Ashram, but we are only trustees."

At least once a year, the Ashram experienced a financial crisis. Gurudev would seriously consider the position and say, "We will be very careful. We won't admit any new aspirants into the Ashram." Usually this only lasted a few days. Soon a poor man would walk in without even a change of clothes asking to stay at the Ashram, Swamiji would say: "Yes, yes........ better let him stay. Where else will he

go? Do not worry about expenses. Every man brings his own ration with him. Before God sends him here, God has already delivered to the kitchen the food supply that he will need."

These were not just words; if you looked into his f ace, into his eyes, you knew he was speaking the truth. In him, there was no doubt at all, there was no questioning. In him, this truth lived. He knew that what you and I call God's will, alone prevailed. If we are going to be bankrupt, we will be bankrupt in any case. There is nothing to worry about! And the secretary submits, "Alright, Swamiji." And then the flood-gates are open again, otherwise the next financial crisis wouldn't come so soon.

Another time we had a classical tragedy. A young man joined the Ashram. He was a ceaseless and untiring worker, brilliant in every way. He had captured the heart of the Master. Gurudev loved him and admired him, and took him into his confidence. He had made him nearly the all-in-all.

He was the post-master, he was the treasurer, he was almost the secretary too, unofficially. He was the cashier and on top of all this, he was also doing some literary work for Gurudev. He was such a dynamic personality, and it was only half an hour after he had left the Ashram one day that it was discovered that he had embezzled, heaven only knows how much! He was the cashier and the post-master, so nobody could really estimate to what extent the Ashram had been robbed. All we knew was this—there was not a single cent in the entire Ashram, which was heavily in debt to local shopkeepers.

So for once again, we started with a minus balance, and the news spread to Rishikesh. Once again, the grocers very politely told the secretary, "For some time it is better to pay cash for whatever you take," because the Ashram owed a lot to them already. That was the worst calamity I have ever seen in the Ashram's life. And what did the Master do? Nothing. Absolutely nothing. He was enjoying the whole thing as a big joke: "How was it possible for him to cheat us like this? He was such a good man! He must be a genius." Two things he went on repeating. "He must have been a genius to do this." And, "But he did a lot of work." He added, "We must have owed him some money—but he could have asked me, I'd have given him." What is that vision, that realisation, established in which one can say this? That is the vision of God.

One more example of this. In 1946, a businessman came to the Ashram from South India. He knew that the Master was very fond of dissemination of spiritual knowledge and that the shelves were full of books which had been printed and published by the Ashram. So, he said to Swamiji, "I can distribute and market all your books in South India. He took a large consignment. Six months later the secretary wrote to the address given by the businessman—the letter was returned, "No such address!" The secretary was amazed. Gurudev said, "Oji, if you think that you are the self of the man who cheated you, you won't be disappointed. If God is one, omnipresent, what is stealing? Stealing is only transferring the object from the right hand to the left hand. You think that you are Swami So-and-so, and that you have an

Ashram, and that those books belong to the Ashram, and someone else took them, and made a profit, and so on. This makes you angry. If you see your own self in that other person, not only would you not feel sorry, but you may even feel happy." Nothing more was said about the whole affair.

"Be equanimous; balanced, even-minded in success and failure, gain and loss." It is not grinning and bearing it—not at all. "He who cheats me, and that which I call 'me', are but the two hands of the omnipresent being, who alone exists!"

But sometimes, to the discomfiture of the authorities of the Ashram, Gurudev could make a big joke of this whole thing. One night the Ashram temple was broken into, although a number of people were sleeping on the covered verandah which went around the four sides of the temple. The silver pot and other silver vessels were missing. The priest who had discovered the loss, reported the theft to the Master. But instead of getting serious, the Master was curious. "People were sleeping right there at the time when the theft was taking place?" Then he burst out laughing. "He must be a very clever thief. If he is found, I'll award him a

title 'Chora Shikhamani' (which means a super-expert in stealing)."

That was all. Gurudev made it look as if there was no theft. He who needed them took them away. He used a very beautiful expression. He used to call it 'Gupta Daan'—secret charity, in which the receiver saved you from even the trouble of giving it! He needed it—he took it.

Once we decided that instead of Swami Sivananda, he should have been called Swami Givananda—he who rejoices in giving. He knew that the supply came from the source, and to the source it returned. Material considerations of accounting did not bother him at all. He proved in his own life that in such generosity, there was no bankruptcy. He used to say very often, "Giving has never made a person poor; charity has never made a person poor." In 1924, the Master arrived in Rishikesh, with only the clothes that he had on his body. In 1973, hardly fifty years later, the Ashram that he had built was worth a few million rupees, and yet he went on giving, giving, giving. He himself used to say, "Such an attitude puts you in direct communion with the inexhaustible source of all prosperity."

SIVA KUTIR OPENED

At 9 a.m., the opening Ceremony "Havan" was going on. Milk was boiling in an adjoining room as is customary in the case of Griha-Pravesha ceremony. Festoons adorned the house everywhere.

Siva graced the Siva Kutir with his august Presence. He witnessed the Havan.

After the Havan was over, Sri Shroff and Srimati Kanta along with the boy Ajai Kumar prostrated before Siva. Siva pronounced his benediction:

"May God bless Sri Shroff, Srimati Kanta and young Ajai Kumar with health, long life, peace, prosperity and Kaivalya! May you all shine as Jeevanmuktas in this very birth."

The function came to a close with a sumptuous feast on the verandah of the Kutir in which Siva himself partook.

Disappointment writ large on his face, Suresh went away. But, and such is the effect of training that these boys have received from Siva; they went ahead with the arrangements for the meeting.

While Siva was returning to his Kutir in the evening, he noticed the children assembled at the meeting-place. Quietly, he also slipped in. Vishnudevji had gone to the bazar already to purchase sweets and tea. Purushottamji brought Siva's harmonium.

Siva conducted Kirtan with the boys. He distributed sweets and tea also. He sang a song composed extempore touching on the glory of the State's heroic patriots, e.g.,

Sumant, Lakshman (the local Congress President), etc. Siva sang the national anthem also. The function was a grand success. All the boys were greatly surprised.

1st FEBRUARY, 1949

Punctually at 12 noon, all Sadhakas and visitors assembled on Ganges bank; Siva was there, too. At a word from him, the function commenced.

Shanti Mantras were repeated. Then a Sankalpa that the worship of the Ganges, the food offerings, Kirtan and prayer were conducted for the peace of the departed souls of all devotees in general and in particular for some whose earthly descendants had requested Siva to pray for their

ancestors.

Then Mrityunjaya Mantra Japa was done followed by Mahamantra Kirtan and consecrated food offerings to the accompanying chant of Vedic Mantras. In the Vishwanath Mandir, special Rudra-Abhishekam had been performed for the peace of departed souls.

Later Siva told us humorously: "All the disembodied spirits were greatly rejoiced today. An entire plane would have been cleared by the celebrations here...... (After a pause added)....... had already a telegraphic communication!" Surely, that is why Siva could not hear the ding-dong of the clock at 9 and at 10, either!

Even so, when you see the world,




Celebration of 100th Sannyasa Diksha Anniversary of Worshipful Gurudev Sri Swami Sivanandaji Maharaj

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
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
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
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
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TWENTY IMPORTANT SPIRITUAL INSTRUCTIONS

By H.H. Sri Swami Sivanandaji Maharaj

- **1. BRAHMA-MUHURTA:** Get up at 4 a.m. daily. This is Brahmamuhurta which is extremely favourable for meditation on God.
- 2. ASANA: Sit on Padma, Siddha or Sukha Asana for Japa and meditation for half an hour, facing the east or the north. Increase the period gradually to three hours. Do Sirshasana and Sarvangasana for keeping up Brahmacharya and health. Take light physical exercises as walking, etc., regularly. Do twenty Pranayamas.
- 3. JAPA: Repeat any Mantra as pure Om or Om Namo Narayanaya, Om Namah Sivaya, Om Namo Bhagavate Vasudevaya, Om Saravanabhavaya Namah, Sita Ram, Sri Ram, Hari Om, or Gayatri, according to your taste or inclination, from 108 to 21,600 times daily.
- 4. DIETETIC DISCIPLINE: Take Sattvic food, Suddha Ahara. Give up chillies, tamarind, garlic, onion, sour articles, oil, mustard, asafoetida. Observe moderation in diet (Mitahara). Do not overload the stomach. Give up those things which the mind likes best for a fortnight in a year. Eat simple food. Milk and fruits help concentration. Take food as medicine to keep the life going. Eating for enjoyment is sin. Give up salt and sugar for a month. You must be able to live on rice, Dhal and bread without any Chutni. Do not ask for extra salt for Dhal and sugar for tea, coffee or milk.
- **5. MEDITATION-ROOM:** Have a separate meditation-room under lock and key.
- **6. CHARITY:** Do charity regularly, every month, or even daily according to your means, say six Paisa per rupee.
- 7. SVADHYAYA: Study systematically the Gita, the Ramayana, the Bhagavata, Sri Vishnu-Sahasranama, Lalita-Sahasranama, Aditya Hridaya, the Upanishads or the Yoga Vasishtha, the Bible, the Zend Avesta, the Koran, the Tripitakas, the Granth Sahib, etc., from half an hour to one hour daily and have Suddha Vichara.
- **8. BRAHMACHARYA:** Preserve the vital force (Veerya) very, very carefully. Veerya is God in

- motion or manifestation—Vibhuti. Veerya is all power. Veerya is all money. Veerya is the essence of life, thought and intelligence.
- **9. PRAYER SLOKAS:** Get by heart some prayer Slokas, Stotras and repeat them as soon as you sit in the Asana before starting Japa or meditation. This will elevate the mind quickly.
- 10. SATSANGA: Have Satsanga. Give up bad company, smoking, meat and alcoholic liquors entirely. Do not develop any evil habits.
- **11. FAST ON EKADASI:** Fast on Ekadasi or live on milk and fruits only.
- **12. JAPA MALA:** Have a Japa Mala (rosary) round your neck or in your pocket or underneath your pillow at night.
- **13. MOUNA:** Observe Mouna (vow of silence) for a couple of hours daily.
- **14. SPEAK THE TRUTH:** Speak the truth at all cost. Speak a little. Speak sweetly.
- **15. PLAIN LIVING:** Reduce your wants. If you have four shirts, reduce the number to three or two. Lead a happy, contented life. Avoid unnecessary worry. Have plain living and high thinking.
- **16. NEVER HURT ANYBODY:** Never hurt anybody (Ahimsa Paramo Dharmah). Control anger by love, Kshama (forgiveness) and Daya (compassion).
- **17. DO NOT DEPEND UPON SERVANTS:** Do not depend upon servants. Self-reliance is the highest of all virtues.
- **18. SELF-ANALYSIS:** Think of the mistakes you have committed during the course of the day, just before retiring to bed (self-analysis). Keep daily diary and self-correction register. Do not brood over past mistakes.
- **19. FULFIL DUTIES:** Remember that death is awaiting you at every moment. Never fail to fulfil your duties. Have pure conduct (Sadachara).
- **20. SURRENDER TO GOD:** Think of God as soon as you wake up and just before you go to sleep. Surrender yourself completely to God (Sharanagati).

Om Santih Santih!

This is the essence of all spiritual Sadhanas. This will lead you to Moksha. All these Niyamas or spiritual canons must be rigidly observed. You must not give leniency to the mind.
